11:00-11:30 am	Deems Tsutakawa Solo	Contemporary Soul Jazz. Not to be missed! A true Live entertainer, Deems music is electrifying. Deems is a Seattle native and performs in many local, national and international venues. We are lucky to have Deems as a part of our Summer Festival lineup!
11:45 am - 12:30 pm	Chinese Community Girls Drill Team	A tradition at Summer Festival. Founded in 1952 by the late Ruby Chow, the Drill Team was founded to foster leadership skills, team building and pride in the Chinese cultural heritage. A powerful, colorful display of synchronized, choreographed movement.
12:45 - 1:30 pm	Master David Leung's Shaolin Kung Fu Academy	Lion Dance/ Martial Arts Kung Fu. Loud pops and fireworks are used to frighten off bad spirits, the Lion Dance bring good luck and fortune.
1:45 - 2:15 pm	Paul Richardson & Josie Howell	Duo of keyboard & Vocal. Very strong jazz performers.
2:30 - 3:15 pm	Halau Hula O'Napualani	Halau Hula 'O Napualani means heavenly blossoms or flowers from heaven. With the discipline of the performing arts, halau members from kids to adults performed with professionalism and grace.
3:30 - 4:00 pm	Rhythms of India	Beautifully-costumed in Native attire, graceful moves tell the story. Dancers specialize in Bhangra, Giddh, Filmi and Semi Classical dances.
4:15 - 6:00 pm	Nine Lives	7-piece dance band, featuring a horn section, plays in style of the early 70's. Think Tower of Power, Chicago. They played at high schools, colleges universities and clubs all around King County. The early 70's was a time when rock soul and jazz came together and we all found the funk! They WILL get you movin!

July 12 Sunday

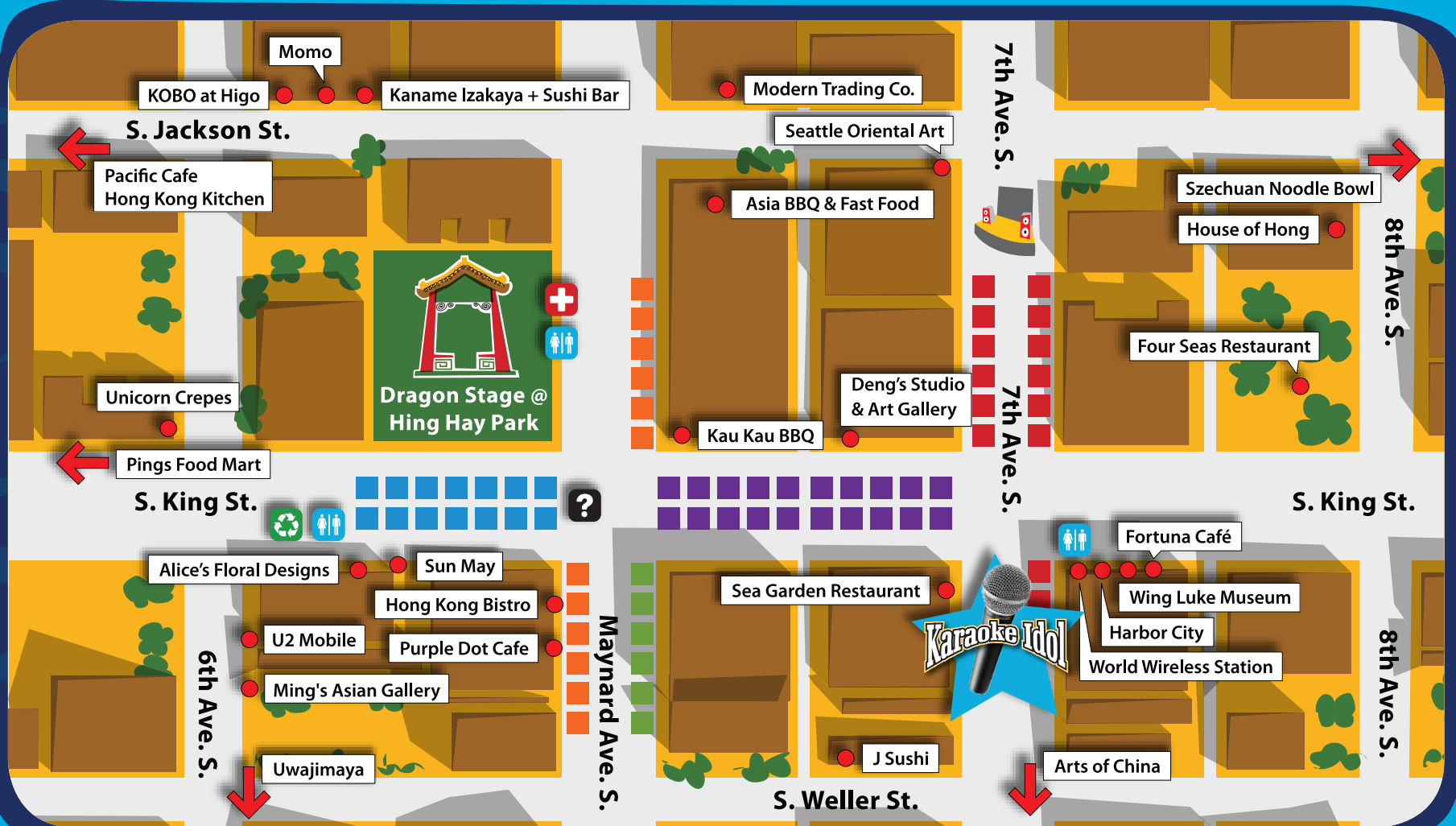

11:45 am - 12:30 pm	Karin Kajita Trio	Karin displays impressive ability as a jazz pianist, both as soloist and accompanist. Her writing is also impressive, showing a nice sense of line, a fresh harmonic sense and a lively rhythmic imagination.
12:45 - 1:30 pm	Seahawks Blue Thunder	Seahawks Blue Thunder is the heartbeat of the fans. This high-energy entertainment drumline was established in 2004 at Qwest Field. Not your typical drum line, they use a variety of rhythms and visual, incorporating rock and roll drumming alongside drum corp style.

2:45 - 3:30 pm	Mak Fai Kung Fu Club	Come see an ancient, traditional form of Chinese Self Defense and the always very popular Lion Dance.
3:45 - 4:30 pm	Alika Nako'oka	Hawaiian recording artist and Maui's favorite son, Alika, will be accompanied by a keyboard player.
4:45 - 6:00 pm	Angelo Pizarro	Acoustic and Electric Guitar Angelo performs nylon/electric improvisational brilliant guitar. "Nylon String Fusion", blending latin, pop, and jazz styles with Filipino-Spanish influences.
